第2問 和訳せよ。

To learn a language is to learn how to listen carefully, what to say in each situation, and when to stop to think before speaking.

第3問 和訳せよ

Choosing to live in a foreign country means learning to observe ordinary things more carefully, because habits taken for granted at home may seem unusual abroad.

Trying to explain your own culture to people asking simple but difficult questions often makes you notice beliefs hidden behind everyday behavior.

To understand another society, it is not enough to memorize facts written in guidebooks; you need to keep comparing what you expected to see with what you actually experience.

第4問 和訳せよ。

Socrates did not claim to possess wisdom in the ordinary sense. Instead, he spent much of his life questioning people who believed they knew what courage, justice, or virtue was. By asking simple but persistent questions, he tried to make them examine assumptions accepted without much thought. What often became clear was not that Socrates had ready-made answers, but that his listeners had been using important words without fully understanding them. To keep questioning oneself, he believed, was better than pretending to know what one had never seriously tried to understand.
